Conducted by the Keeper of Archives, Calista Lucy, this historical and architectural tour of the College includes the James Caird whaleboat in which Shackleton, the college's most famous old boy, saved his companions who were marooned in Antarctica. You will also visit the reconstruction of P. G. Wodehouse's study with the furniture and memorabilia presented to the College by his widow. The Archive is home to a collection of rare books and manuscripts, including the Wodehouse manuscripts, architectural drawings and the Shackleton photographs. The tour lasts for 1.5 hours.
